At a meeting of the Royal English Agricultural Society last week, interesting information was elicited regarding the relative merits of Scotch and Irish cows, as far as the produce of milk and butter is concerned. Agricultural friends in Kerry will be glad to learn that the decision of such a tribunal is completely in favour of their far-famed heifers.

The situation of Lieutenant-Governor of Quebec is vacant by the death of General Dilkes, formerly of the Fusileer Guards.

The following Noblemen died last year:—Marquis of Lothian; Earls of Rosse, O'Neill, Somers, Rotnes, Belmore, Fortescue, Home, Malmesbury, Elgin, Harewood, Westmoreland, Egmont, and Falmouth; Lords Henley, Wrottesley, Dufferin, Feversham and Sydenham.

The Lord Chancellor has been pleased to appoint William Hamo De Massy, Esq. of Glenwilliam Castle, a Magistrate of this County, upon the recommendation of Col. the Hon. R. FitzGibbon, County Lieutenant.

A serious accident occurred on Christmas day, at a place called Screen, county of Sligo; an immense number assembled at chapel, and during the celebration of mass the floors gave way, and all were precipitated to the ground floor. Several persons were killed on the spot, and many have since died from the effects of the fall and bruises.

Thirteen Protestants are committed to Downpatrick gaol, for the murder of a man of the name of M'Ardle, a Roman Catholic at Rathfriland. M'Ardle was nephew of the late Dean M'Ardle of Loughbrickland.

The Galway Savings' Bank and Provident Institution, established under the 9th Geo. IV. c. 92, was opened on Monday last.

Galway Quarter Sessions commenced on Saturday. Wm. Deane Freeman, Esq. Q. C. presiding. The Attorney General having decided that Fishermen who retailed fish, and lived exclusively by their traffic, were entitled to their freedom, some hundreds were placed on the roll. Some of them attended this Court to be registered, and Mr. Freeman, after having cited authorities in support of his views, rejected indiscriminately all the persons admitted by Mr. Lynch, and would not hear them until they be six months enrolled. He then told Mr. John Blakeney, solicitor for the fishermen, that he neither now nor at any future period would admit the fishermen, differing as he did in opinion from the law advisers of the Crown. It was finally agreed that an appeal be entered for one or two, to be argued before a higher tribunal, on whose decision the issue for all would be taken.

Loughrea Quarter Sessions commenced on Monday before William Dean Freeman, Esq. Assistant-Barrister. The ejectments were principally at the suit of the Marquis of Clanricarde, and the defendants being in general of a most distressed class, elicited from the Court, when pronouncing its decree, the expression of a wish that something would be done to better the condition of the wretched town of Loughrea and its unfortunate inhabitants. A miller of the name of Harsman, from Eyrecourt, decreed a number of people for oatmeal he gave out on time in July—if paid the 1st November, the price to be 16s.—if not, 11. 1s. For the latter sum he decreed all.

At a meeting of the Newcastle Temperance Society on Sunday, Mr. John Foley was elected Vice President of the society for the present year.

At the fair of Kilmeedy, on Friday, with cows averaged from 7 to 10*l.*, in-calf heifers 7 to 9*l.*, strippers 5 to 7*l.* There was a small supply of fat cattle in the fair averaging from 7 to 11*l.*, year-and-half old rated from 4 to 5*l.*, yearlings 2 to 3*l.* 5*s.*, sheep 27*s.* to 36*s.* a piece; bacon pigs were purchased from 36*s.* to 41*s.* a cwt, store pigs 24*s.* to 56*s.* a cwt.

Henry Owen, Esq. is appointed to survey and value the corporation property of Maryboro'.

Mr. Briscoe, Poor-rate collector, has tendered his resignation to the Birr Union Guardians, finding it impossible to collect the rate from the poor.

Charleville, per the Rev. Thomas Croke, has remitted £25 to the O'Connell tribute, and Cappawhite, £19.

George Roche, brought up at Guildhall, Plymouth, at the instance of P. W. Vanderkiste, Esq. Port Collector, was sentenced to £100 fine or six months' imprisonment, for having eight gallons of contraband brandy.

The County Carlow is about to meet for an address to the Lord Lieutenant.

Counsellor Brereton attended the Wicklow registry sessions for the Conservatives, where he registered 12 to two.
